RECEPTION/YEAR 1 CLASS NEWS

In the Reception and Year One classroom, we have been engaging in daily explicit phonics experiences. When a new phoneme (letter sound) is introduced, we sing a song about our new phoneme, practise our letter formation in many ways, brainstorm words that include our new sound and practise blending phonemes together to read and write new words. At the end of each week, we consolidate our learning by participating in hands-on phonics rotation experiences.

IS YOUR CHILD SAFE ONLINE?

Help your children safely navigate their digital world and educate them to avoid harmful online experiences. Explore websites, games, apps and social media together and set some rules.

Technology tips for parents of kids 5 to 12

Ensure your own devices are protected by a password or pin, so your child cannot accidentally come across inappropriate content. If you are thinking about giving them their own tablet or smartphone, ASK YOURSELF are they old enough?

Use parental control tools appropriate for the age and experience of your child. Be upfront about this and get your child on board. Let them know that these can be reviewed and changed as they get older and they continue to demonstrate responsible behaviour. Consider installing a 'child-friendly' search engine that will allow them to explore a limited number of sites.

We are now in the third week of Lent with the Project Compassion story of Janice, a Wagilak woman and traditional dancer who tells her family's stories through movements handed down over generations.

Like many remote Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities, Janice's faces a range of challenges – low employment and education, financial hardship, poorer health and lower life expectancy.

With your help, Caritas Australia supports Djilpin Arts Aboriginal Corporation, which operates a centre for traditional and contemporary Aboriginal arts and culture, providing employment and generating income for local communities.

Janice believes that Djilpin Arts' work is essential to create opportunities for young people to stay on-country, to share intergenerational knowledge between elders and the younger generation - to promote healing, and to keep culture alive.
