Dear Parents and Friends

COVID UPDATE

If your child is symptom free, please send them to school. It is important for their own wellbeing and the continuation of their learning that they attend. Our school staff are incredibly diligent in following the educational processes to mitigate any spread.

If your child is in isolation/quarantine due to being a close contact outside of school, please contact me and we will do what we can to provide learning for your child.

If your child is unwell with cold symptoms, they need to remain home. They need to rest, recover and return to school when they are well.

If a positive case is reported to us, you will be notified via email. As a small community we feel that it is essential to keep open lines of communication with families. Presently, there have been a number of increased cases reported in surrounding towns. We are keeping a careful eye on these reports. If this impacts any up and coming events, including sport trainings, namely SAPSASA, we will communicate this to families as soon as possible.

BUILDING PROJECT UPDATE

Our building project is nearly complete. The expected move in date is May 19. We have been able to have a sneak peak and it is looking fantastic. Walls are up and plastered. The new Woods Learning Centre is also close to lock up stage.

Climbing Tree have provided a detailed plan of our Nature Play area, which will be undertaken after the classes move back into their learning spaces.

DIBELS

The school has recently begun to use whole-school data to track the progress of students' literacy skills on an individual basis. DIBELS stands for the Dynamic Indicators of Basic Early Literacy Skills and is a set of procedures and measures for assessing the acquisition of literacy skills. They are designed to be short fluency measures that can be used to regularly detect risk and monitor the development of early literacy and early reading skills from Year 2 to Year 6.

The research-based tasks focus on early literacy skills that are foundational to students' reading proficiency and later reading development. The tests are informative to teaching practices and allows teachers to monitor individual targeted needs for students.

The first set of testing was conducted within the first part of the term with the information being analysed by classroom teachers.

If you would like further information on the whole-school data being collected to inform teaching and learning, feel free to contact our Leader of Learning, Sam Baxter or your child's classroom teacher.

PE

Physical Education is valued at MMMS as an integral aspect of every child's development. There is a strong emphasis on skill development through a physical education program that is based on fine and gross motor skill development. The skills taught in the PE area comprise one of three strands in the Health and Physical Education Curriculum. Miss Amy Boyd is our qualified PE teacher (she is an enthusiastic sports person herself) Amy conducts lessons with all classes to develop a range of skills and our students are encouraged to have a healthy and positive attitude towards participation and competition.

PALM SUNDAY AND HOLY WEEK

This Sunday marks the beginning of Holy Week with the celebration of Palm Sunday. Palm Sunday is when Catholic's remember Jesus entering into Jerusalem to the crowds cheering and welcoming Him as 'King'.

Holy Week then helps us to prepare for the events of Holy Thursday and Good Friday. We remember the Last Supper and the vents of Good Friday, culminating in the Passion and crucifixion of Christ.

This week students will be undertaking a series of classroom liturgies and activities to remember the

events of Holy Week and eventually Easter in Term 2. Through these liturgies and reflections we are able to explore in more detail the love and compassion that Jesus has for us all.



SHANIELLA

This week through Project Compassion we learn about Shaniella who is attending a vocational school in the Solomon Islands supported by Caritas Australia Solomon Islands (CASI).

Not long after Shaniella started, the school was hit by a landslide, flooding, and a cyclone, all in quick succession.

With your kind support, CASI helped install water tanks, restoring clean water access to nearby schools, health centres and the wider community. Training was held in agricultural skills to help boost the school community's food security, as well as in environmental risk management and emergency responses.

Now, Shaniella can complete her skills training, with

enough water and food to eat, and improved sanitation. She is improving her ability to earn an income, learning skills which will expand her job opportunities. Students are also better prepared to respond when disaster strikes.

EASTER EGGS

The Easter egg is a popular and much loved symbol of Easter, the celebration of the resurrected Christ. So what is the connection? The Easter egg, being a hollow egg is reminiscent of the tomb that Jesus was placed in after His death on the Cross. This tomb was found empty by His disciples on the Sunday morning. The opening of the empty egg and the cracking of the outer 'shell' is much like the opening of the empty tomb, revealing the resurrection of Jesus on the morning of Easter Sunday.

Due to this connection we ask that during Holy Week, before Easter Sunday, that no easter eggs are sent in or brought to school.




