Combined School Board Meeting

Tuesday night the Mary MacKillop Memorial School Board hosted the Combined School Board Meeting and dinner. MMMS, St Anthony's Catholic Primary School Board, Millicent and Tenison Woods College Board gathered together for an opportunity to make connections and have conversations with other parents from our neighbouring Catholic schools in the region. Mrs Trish Jarvis, from Catholic School Parents SA spoke to the group about the role of this organisation. Mr Dave Edwards, from Catholic Education South Australia Office led the group through the new Catholic Education South Australia Strategy - Towards 2027: Expanding Horizons and Deepening Practices. He explained the commitments of seven key areas and the importance of the Living Learning Leading Framework within this strategy. There was much affirmation of what the three schools do to grow young people who are 'thriving people, capable learners and leaders for the world God desires.' I would like to thank the MMMS School Board members for their hospitality on the evening to other school board members and for assisting in organising the evening. I also thank them for their commitment to the task and the role that they undertake for the betterment of our school.

I especially would like to thank Charlie, Poppy, Emalee and Alida for serving our visitors and conducting school tours of our new learning spaces. Many people commented on what a wonderful job they did. All four students conducted themselves with confidence and maturity.



REPORTS and LEARNING CONVERSATIONS

Teachers are currently finalising student reports. We use a range of accumulated assessments from the planned learning experiences taught throughout Term 1 and 2 to provide a summary achievement report for parents/caregivers. You will receive your child's report this Friday, 24th June.

You will also receive your interview time for next week. Learning conversations with teachers allows for clarification of reports and further discussion on your child's learning after the first Semester. It is an opportunity to set goals for the remainder of the year. If you are unable to make your time, please contact Janice as soon as possible. The Learning Conversation is a commitment which we make together as a school community as we are in partnership with each other in the journey of every child becoming 'thriving people, capable learners and leaders for the world God desires.'

RESTORATIVE PRACTICE – Resilient Impact

Each individual's dignity and wellbeing is important at Mary MacKillop Memorial School. Respecting the desire and possibility for connection rather than disconnection in relationships is paramount. We do this through growth coaching conversations that strengthen the connections between relationships and learning. The principle of resilient impact assists us to respect relationships and encourage personal accountability without 'shame and blame'. When the actions of a student or a group of students causes

harm and upset, those involved in the particular problem are called to a process called a coaching conversation, where we focus on What's happened, What's important and How will we act. This conversation draws out people's stories surrounding the incident. Students are given a voice and asked to accept responsibility for their actions, make things right and make agreements about how things will be in the future. This practice is our culture and encompasses our Catholic ethos and Mission, Vision and Values statements.

Recently we have had families tour our school. I enjoy sharing with families about what makes our school unique, the tradition and history of Mary MacKillop Memorial School. I also take great pride in explaining the rigorous learning that takes place and the nurturing environment we provide for each student.

NATIONAL CONSISTENT COLLECTION OF DATA

Every year all schools are required to collect data on students with a disability for whom the curriculum is adjusted in some way(s). The National Consistent Collection of Data on school students with disability reinforces the obligations schools have under the Commonwealth Disability Discrimination Act 1992 and the Disability Standards for Education 2005. It counts the number of students who are supported under these obligations based on the professional judgement of teacher and their knowledge and understanding of their students', consultation with leadership and outside agencies and professionals. This also includes students with a Personalised Plan for Learning and individualised Education Plan. This is an anonymous process, and no student is identified by name or location of school. WHAT IS WORLD MEETING **OF FAMILIES?**

WMOF is the acronym for World Meeting of Families, founded by Pope John Paul II in 1994.

The United Nations declared the "International Year of the Family" in 1994 and as a response, Pope John Paul II incorporated this celebration of family within our Church by creating the first World Meeting of Families in Rome that October. It has since been held every 3 years in different places around the world.

WMOF was first promoted by the Pontifical Council for the Family, which later merged with the Dicastery for the Laity, Family and Life. The event has always started and concluded with an international Theological-Pastoral Congress, in the presence of the Pope, along with a Vigil and Festival of Families and a great final Eucharistic celebration.
