PERFORMING ARTS

This week, we commenced our Footsteps Dance program in our Performing Arts lessons. We enjoyed learning some warm up moves and dance steps to the song 'Hot Hot Hot'.

VISUAL ARTS

In Visual Art students have been engaged in a range of different topics and mediums. The R/1's created life sized self-portraits which are now on display in our school hall. The Junior Primary classes have begun an artist study of Australian artist and illustrator Alison Lester and have written a letter to her, asking lots of questions! The 4/5 class is continuing their exploration of Impressionism, which has included sponge painting and tissue paper collages inspired by the work of Claude Monet and are now working on developing their skills with soft pastels. The Year 6's have begun an independent art project on the topic of 'Mary MacKillop', in which they are selecting their focus and medium. We look forward to seeing the final results!

SCIENCE

In Science we have been exploring the Earth and Space strand. In the R/1 class students have investigated daily and seasonal weather and observed the related effect on the sky and landscape. The students made wind chimes, conducted investigations of hot and cold temperatures and wind strength, and created their own weather symbols. Both the 2/3 and 4/5 classes ventured into outer space, with the 2/3 students exploring how the rotation of the Earth results in day and night and the 4/5 class investigating our solar system. The Year 6 class has been exploring volcanoes and their formation, including an investigation of lava viscosity.

COVID Update

Mary MacKillop Feast Day

This upcoming Monday, the 8th of August, we celebrate the Feast Day of St Mary of the Cross (Mary MacKillop). This feast day is extra special in Australia as we gather to celebrate the first and only recognised Australian saint.

We will be having a day of celebrations on Monday, beginning with a whole school Mass in the church at 9:15am. I extend a warm welcome to all families and friends of Mary Mackillop Memorial School. After Mass students will gather in their classrooms to continue their learning about St Mary and then join in a series of activities for the remainder of the day.

I feel that we are very blessed to walk on the same ground that St Mary did in the mid to late 1800's.

Who was Mary MacKillop

Mary was born to Scottish Immigrants on the 15th of January, 1842 in Fitzroy, Melbourne. It was from her parents that Mary learned the importance of a good education. In 1860, at the age of 18, Mary arrived in our town of Penola.

It was here that she met Fr Julian Tenison Woods (a remarkable priest and scientist) and set up her first school, holding lessons in a small cottage. In 1866 Mary set up her first dedicated school in a stable. This site is remembered today as the Mary MacKillop Stable School Park and is located on Queen Street. It was here that Mary truly began her vocation.

In 1867, the classes shifted to a purpose-built school building now referred to as the Woods-MacKillop Schoolhouse, which is located on the corner of Petticoat Lane. While in Penola Mary started up the Sisters of St Josephs, with the help of Father Julian Tenison Woods.

Within weeks of the Schoolhouse opening, Mary MacKillop boarded the steamship SS Penola for the journey to Adelaide, where she went on to establish the Cathedral Hall School, officially took vows and became Mary of the Cross.

Once she left Penola Mary's story continued, she suffered many trials but kept on doing Gods work.

I encourage everyone this weekend to get out and see some of the wonderful Mary Mackillop history in our town.
