We explored the notion of a 'learning pit' and reminded ourselves that it is okay to find new leaning difficult and challenging. As a class we created our own versions of the 'learning pit' and explored how we use our growth mindset strategies to help pull us out of the pit. Our next step is to ensure we use these strategies when facing challenges in order to grow as learners.

We shared our work at the assembly in week 2 and were lucky enough to have the talented news reporters of 5/6 to lead us in this sharing.

Counsellor's Corner

The concepts of winning and losing appear frequently during a child's life, and whilst these emotions can be difficult to process for our young people, in doing so, they learn valuable social skills and life lessons to help them in the future. Being able to win well and lose gracefully are skills that generally do not come naturally to children and have to be learnt. With the recent swimming carnival and many sporting events awaiting us this year, we thought it would be helpful to provide you with a few tips on how to process these events with your child/ren:

Preparation is key

Preparing kids that they might or might not win ahead of time is very important. Processing feelings ahead of time can take much of the pressure off when the child later experiences a win or loss. For example "How do you think you might feel if you win or lose in tomorrow's race?" This gives children a safe space to explore how they might feel if they do win or lose a race so that they are not surprised by their emotions on the day, as well as to curb any pre-event anxiety.

Winning well

A child's reaction is usually to celebrate a win. It's great to celebrate with your children when they win, but also provides a rare teaching moment where parents/caregivers are able to direct a child's behaviour to also consider their peers. For example: "Great job! I'm proud of you. Why don't we go and congratulate the other competitors? We could say well done, great race!" This helps children to feel proud of themselves for their achievements whilst simultaneously being aware of the feelings of those around them – a valuable social skill.

Losing gracefully

As with winning, losing can also cause (sometimes overwhelming) emotions for a child who may not have the life experience to process those emotions

easily. Allowing a child to release feelings of disappointment in a safe space is very helpful in learning how to lose. We can suggest and model saying "Well done, great race" to the other competitors so that children can see HOW to lose well.

Debriefing

Talking to our child/ren after the event allows them to process any questions or remaining emotions from the event. For example, "I can see that you are disappointed at losing today. How are you feeling about it now? Are you happy with how you treated the other competitors today? Is there anything you could do differently next time?"

Praising effort, not results

Whilst winning or losing an event can be the main focus for a child, when we praise their efforts we show them that it is not only the end result that is important. For example, "I know you may not have won today, but your showed real perseverance during your training and I can see that you tried your best today, I am proud of you for that."

Again, remember that winning well and losing gracefully are behaviours that can be practiced. They take time, but in the long run are helpful in moulding actions that are considerate of others.
