Dear Families and Friends of Mary MacKillop Memorial School,

Strategic Planning Towards 2029

Recently I have had the pleasure of working with staff, School Board and students asking and gaining insights into the future of our school. Some of the provocations were; What do we keep doing? What should we continue to improve in? What have we already accomplished? What new initiatives could we begin? These questions assisted our thinking under the quadrants of the Catholic Education South Australia Living Learning Leading Standards: Catholic Identity, Curriculum and Coconstructed learning and assessment design, Student agency, identity, learning and leadership, Community engagement and Resources. The data gathered from the different stakeholders will be collated and then with assistance from Heidi Glashan from High Performing Schools, we will formulate our new strategic plan - Towards 2029. Encouraging Flexible Thinking to Help Your Child Build Friendships

As children grow, they encounter situations where may have different ideas friends preferences. These are ideal moments opportunities to teach *flexible* thinkina. an important skill for building strong friendships!

What's the Difference Between Rigid and Flexible Thinking?

Rigid thinking is when a child gets "stuck" on their own way of doing things. For example, if your child really wants to play soccer but their friends suggest hide-and-seek, rigid thinking may lead to frustration or even refusal to play. This can make friendships difficult because friends might feel that their ideas aren't valued.

Flexible thinking, however, is the ability to adapt and consider other's perspectives. If your child is flexible, they might respond with, "Let's play hideand-seek first, and maybe soccer later!"

Flexible thinking not only helps children feel calmer when plans change but also shows friends that they're open to collaboration and compromise.

How to Support Flexible Thinking:

Help your child develop this skill by encouraging them to:

- Take a deep breath to manage disappointment
- · Ask questions about their friend's ideas to show interest
- Suggest taking turns or trying new activities

Teaching your child flexible thinking can make a big difference in their social skills and friendships \odot .
