Mary MacKillop Memorial School Values

This year, we embarked on an important journey as a school community: to reflect deeply on our values and ensure they are visible, memorable, and truly representative of who we are.

The process began in 2023 when we reviewed our vision, mission, and values statements. We quickly realized that these statements, while meaningful, were not well-known by our students. This discovery inspired us to dive deeper into the values of the Josephite sisters—the order founded by Mary MacKillop—and to explore how these values are lived out in our school community.

Guided by the Josephite tradition and the Gospel message of Jesus, we refined our focus to four core values that reflect the teachings of St Mary of the Cross and the people we strive to be:

- **We love**
- **We are courageous**
- **We serve**
- **We are present**

These values were intentionally written as 'we' statements to emphasize that they are more than just words—they are actions we can take to create a better world for all.

To bring these values to life, we engaged in meaningful research and dialogue throughout the year. We explored the life and legacy of St Mary of the Cross MacKillop, collaborated with the Sisters of St Joseph, and most importantly, listened to our students. Their insights were invaluable as they shared what these values mean to them, how they see them in action, and the ways they live them out every day.

This journey has been nothing short of inspiring. As a staff, we have been moved by the ways our students embody these values in their words and actions. Whether it's through acts of kindness, moments of bravery, or simply being present for others, our students continue to remind us of the power and purpose behind these principles.

As we continue this journey together, we remain committed to making these values a living, breathing part of our school culture. They guide not only what we do but also who we aspire to be—both as individuals and as a community.

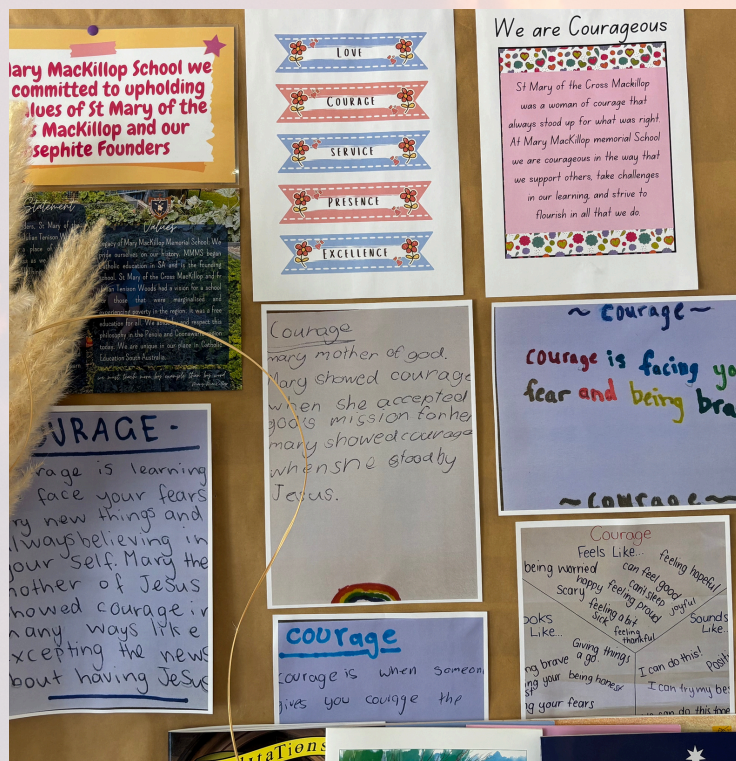
Thankyou
